December 3, 1878

W.C.White, Dear Son,

I send a trunk full of Pecan nuts to you. I pay for them here, \$5.00, or \$1.25 per bushel.

I wish you to give one peck to Elder Farnsworth. Say to him that Brother Daniells helped pack the nuts, and suggested that he wished to send them to him.

Also, take four quarts to Brother Daniell's sister. She has been at the Sanitarium. Maybe she is going to school. Also, take four quarts to Mother Smith, and tell her that I send them at the suggestion of Elder Kilgore and his wife.

I can ship these nuts for the Sanitarium. These I got of a friend below the market price, which is \$1.00 per bushel. See Dr. Kellogg on the subject.

We go to Denison today where we hope to find Sister Booth.

Brother A.H. Kringof (sp?) of Dallas, Broom-maker, will be with you in one or two weeks. Give him some attention. He wants to visit the Kellogg factory, and gather all the important improvements possible.

I take hold to help him. He has a great chance to do business here. He will want to find out the price of Michigan handles and the cost of a carload to Dallas.

Help him all you can, on my account.
